

CODE	Meaning	What to do
<b>CODE BLUE</b>	Adult need for cardiopulmonary resuscitation or emergency assistance	Dial extension 9999 and tell operator 'Code Blue' and location If BLS certified, begin CPR until Code team arrives
<b>CODE RED</b>	Fire	Remember <b>RACE</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Remove persons from immediate danger</li> <li>• Activate the nearest fire alarm</li> <li>• Confine the fire, close all doors; Call Operator to report exact location</li> <li>• Extinguish the fire/Evacuate area</li> </ul>
<b>CODE ORANGE</b>	Hazardous material	The receiving point for potentially contaminated and/or irradiated patients is the Emergency Department. As soon as the ED staff receives notification of the impending admission, a <b>Code Triage Standby</b> will be called.
<b>CODE TRIAGE STANDBY</b>	Impending Event Alert	This alert activates Incident Commander who is the EHS is the Patient Flow/House Supervisor.
<b>CODE TRIAGE ACTIVATE</b>	Activates the Emergency Response Plan	Each department will have Departmental Emergency Management Plans that will include call lists and specific job responsibilities
<b>CODE BLACK</b>	Severe weather	Each department will have Departmental Emergency Management Plans that will include call lists and specific job responsibilities
<b>CODE EVACUATION</b>	Evacuate facility or specific area	Departmental Emergency Management Plans will include evacuation job assignments, established evacuation routes and procedures.
<b>CODE LOCKDOWN</b>	Lockdown of the facility or specific areas in the event of a terrorist attack, identified disaster, Infant/Child Abduction, or civil disturbance.	"Code Lockdown" will be announced by intercom and paged. Security Department personnel will have the primary responsibility for locking all exits and entrances. It is important that all staff members understand, support and participate in lockdown procedures.

CODE	Meaning	What to do
CODE SILVER	Active Shooter	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>CALL</b> Security Dispatch at ext. 6911 (emergency extension)</li> <li>• Take note of the two nearest exits in any facility you visit</li> <li>• If you are in an office, stay there and secure the door and avoid windows.</li> <li>• If you are in a hallway, get into a room and secure the door.</li> </ul>
CODE GREY	Violent Behavior Response	In the event of verbally abusive patients or visitors, call Security Dispatch at extension 7614 and advised of the nature of the incident; In the event of threats of <i>violent</i> acts: Call Security Dispatch Emergency ext. at 6911
CODE GREY B	Bomb Threat	<p>When a bomb threat telephone call is received:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Do not attempt to transfer the call to any other station.</li> <li>• Keep the caller on the line as long as possible. Ask caller to repeat the message.</li> <li>• Call House Supervisor, Security Supervisor, Security officer on duty</li> </ul>
CODE 5 (FIVE)	Pediatric CPR: Healthcare professionals provide immediate resuscitative needs and stabilization of the pediatric patient	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The staff person who finds the patient requiring emergency assistance should activate a CODE 5 by dialing 9999.</li> <li>• Inform the operator to call a CODE 5 and tell them the location. <b>REPEAT</b> "CODE 5" and repeat the location.</li> </ul>
CODE PINK	Infant Abduction	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Push "Code Pink" Panic button (Women's Services)</li> <li>• Notify Security and Hospital operator. Inform operator of your name, exact location, &amp; have operator announce the following: "code pink" followed by age, sex, &amp; race of infant/child</li> </ul>
CODE ELLA	Missing patient	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• If a patient cannot be located during a unit search, a member of the staff will immediately call Security Dispatch Center (6911) and request a <b>Code ELLA</b> be paged overhead.</li> <li>• The staff member will give the following information to be included in the page: Age, Ethnicity, Gender, Height/Weight, Hair Color/Length, Last location</li> <li>• All staff members should monitor exits and corridors in their area for individuals who meet the description provided.</li> </ul>
